Awareness Program on Online Pass Creation

Today, on 10/11/2025,

an awareness program organized was Government College, Dehra, District Kangra (HP), in collaboration with the Himachal Road Transport Corporation (HRTC), Dehra, educate students about the process of creating passes (college/ITI/school/HRT C passes) online.

During the program, Mr. Sanjay, RRTC, Dehra, explained to students the entire process of creating passes online by visiting the Him Access Portal (https://sso.hp.gov.in).

Students were told how to register as a new user by going to the "Citizen" section, login generating an OTP using their Aadhaar number or mobile number, then go to "All Services," select the HRTC option, and click on "Passes" to the online complete application process. Officiating Principal Monika Sharma praised the program. Assistant Professors Nisha Kumari, Dr. Parveen Kumar, Shivani Gupta, Nivedita Chauhan and from non-teaching staff, Mr. Ashok Kumar, Ram Dyal, Munish Bhalwal were present on the occasion.

Tobacco Prohibition Awareness Campaign

On November 14, 2025, members of the Red Ribbon Club of Government College, Dehra, District Kangra, conducted a special awareness campaign in response to the Tobacco and TB Awareness Letter (dated November 24, 2024) issued by the Chief Medical Officer, Kangra.
